## Introduction

There is no extension activity sheet for this programme. It would be very simple to ask children who are not scribing to draw their own funny monster.

This programme has proved very popular with the youngest children who enjoy thinking up names and games for the funny monsters. (They are all small and cuddly and very un-monster like.)

This story starter could be introduced through a collection of friendly toy creatures, or through drama where the children could explore shape and size activities acting as the different creatures.

This is an ideal story starter to give to older children scribing for younger ones as it needs little introduction.
