Introduction

This Scribing programme was created especially to demonstrate how popular TV characters can easily be co-opted to support Scribing with young children.

I bought a pair of Wotwot plush toys because I liked the way they could grow ears, tails, feet, and wings inspired by different creatures allowing for focus on parts of the body, ears, arms, feet and so on and offered opportunities for movement and so on. You don't necessarily need the toys.

Other children's book and TV characters can easily be adapted for Scribing.. Most characters for children are designed to have memorable character traits. Many have their own songs and rhymes/. This makes them particularly suitable. What could you do with Peppa Pig or it's up to you.

Pictures can be simply selected from google images to make quick and easy Scribing programmes.
